

Sustainable Development Factsheet

Tree Preservation Order



- 1. Byron Shire Council Tree Preservation Order applies to the following vegetation on land to which *Byron Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 1988* applies:
 - a) any species of tree, palm or fern exceeding three (3) metres in height,
 - b) any species of native plant within a community described as heath, mangrove, saltmarsh or sedgeland (of any height).

Note: This Tree Preservation Order does not apply to vegetation on land to which **Byron LEP 2014** applies. **Chapter B2 – Preservation of Trees and Other Vegetation of Byron Development Control Plan 2014** applies instead to vegetation on this land.

- 2. Notwithstanding Clause (1), this Order does not apply to:
 - a) any tree grown for its edible fruit (other than species listed in the Threatened Species Conservation Act, 1995),
 - b) minor pruning or lopping associated with regular garden maintenance,
 - c) trees planted as part of a windbreak to an orchard,
 - d) trees planted for commercial woodlots or farm forestry,
 - e) trees within two (2) metres of the footprint of an existing building,
 - f) trees under and within two (2) metres of the footprint of a building for which a construction certificate has been issued:
 - g) trees listed in Attachment One as Undesirable Trees.
 - h) trees in Council caravan parks where removal or lopping is consistent with an adopted vegetation management plan.
 - i) Up to six (6) regrowth trees of less than ten (10) years of age per holding in a twelve (12) month period on any rural zoned land.

List of undesirable trees
